



## Dear Women in Mining Canada (WIMC) Members,

On behalf of the board of directors, it is my pleasure to provide the report to the members for the fiscal year ended October 31, 2022.

In 2022 we welcomed six new directors to the board: Alina Antonie, Valeria Cardozo Noriega, Sheila Colman, Sekai Musoki, Maria Natalia Vellejo Garcia, & Bethany Borody. With the substantial turnover in directorship, the board focused hard on the on-boarding process and assigning new roles, while still devoting extensive time to continuing to develop the initiatives already established the previous year. I would like to express my gratitude to Valentina Marinova, Kevin D'Souza, & Bethany Borody for their contributions to this organization as they step down from the board to pursue other projects.

The 2023 Women in Mining Canada Trailblazer Awards & the Mining for Diversity event saw substantial growth this year. The awards recognize the achievements of women and mentors who have made significant contributions to the Canadian mining industry and promote the inclusion of women. In 2023 we received a record number of nominations in the Student Trailblazer category and the reception itself saw attendance that consisted of only standing room remaining. The award winners include: Trailblazer – Chafika Eddine, Trailblazer Student – Kathryn Cheng, Indigenous Trailblazer – Freda Campbell, Indigenous Student Trailblazer – Emma Plant, and the Rick Hutson Mentorship – Rachel Pineault.

As Canadian companies increase business in Latin America, WIMC has been in increased contact with ambassadors, both Canadian and from Latin American countries on the topic of diversity and inclusive culture. As a result, we have been in contact with several WIM groups in Latin America in a joint effort to share lessons learnt and a positive path forward.

This year's sponsorship drive was extremely successful. With an increased effort to promote our sponsors in newsletters and social media in combination with the topic of inclusivity gaining traction in the industry, we have seen successes such as increasing our diamond sponsors to three, attracting our first drill service company to sponsor, and having returning sponsors.
